May Spotlight: Bishop KIm Lucas



The Rt. Rev. Kimberly (Kym) Lucas was ordained and consecrated as the eleventh bishop of the Episcopal Church in Colorado on May 18, 2019 at Saint John's Cathedral in Denver.

Lucas became the first woman bishop as well as the first African American bishop in the diocese's 132-year history.

Lucas was chosen as the eleventh bishop of the Episcopal Church in Colorado during its 131st Annual Convention on Saturday, October 27, 2018.

Lucas has served as Rector of St.
Margaret's Episcopal Church in
Washington, D.C. since January
2012. Previously, she was the Rector
of St. Ambrose Episcopal Church in
Raleigh, NC, from 2005 to 2011.

Bishop Lucas grew up in Spring Lake, North Carolina and received her Bachelor of Science in Biology from Wake Forest University.

She received her Master of Divinity, New Testament, at Union Theological Seminary in New York. Bishop Lucas and her husband, Mark Retherford, have four children.

LAYMEN'S APRIL FOCUS: CELEBRATING AND HONORING MOTHERS

WHY DO WE CELEBRATE MOTHERS DAY?

It all dates back to Ann Maria Reeves Jarvis, a social activist and community organizer, during the Civil War era. Before the Civil War, Jarvis, of West Virginia, created the Mother's Day Work Club, with the goal of teaching local ladies how to care for their children.


These clubs unified women. And in 1868, Jarvis came up with something called Mothers' Friendship Day, which had moms of Confederate and Union soldiers come together to promote harmony.

Right around the same time, suffragette Julia Ward Howe, in 1870, wrote what's called the Mother's Day Proclamation, to promote world peace and pushed for a Mother's Peace Day to be celebrated in June.

Meanwhile, in the 1900s, Anna Jarvis, daughter of Ann, came up with a fairly genius idea that was ahead of its time: A day to honor mothers and the sacrifices they make for their kids.

Thus, Mother's Day was born.







When her mother died on May 23, 1905, Anna Jarvis worked untiringly to have the second Sunday in May set aside each year as a day of honor to the mothers of the nation. Bettmann Archive

Ironically, Jarvis herself was both unmarried and childless. Go figure. But she pushed to have her holiday added to the calendar by kicking off a letter-writing campaign.
